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Central Mindanao University •••••••••••••••••••••••••••••••••••	Established in 1910, Central Mindanao University, is known to be the academic paradise of Southern Philippines. It all started as a settlement farm school, one of the few in the island of Mindanao organized by pioneering Americans in 1910. Simply named Mailag Industrial School, this pilot school offered only the first four grades of the elementary agriculture curriculum. In later years, it transferred to other locations to provide education to the Province of Bukidnon which resulted to its conversion as an agricultural state college. In 1952, then President Elpidio Quirino signed Republic Act 807, otherwise known as Mindanao Agricultural College (MAC) Charter. The school site in Musuan, Bukidnon provided fertile and wide tracts of land ideal for diverse agricultural tillage that President Carlos P. Garcia, through the Secretary of Agriculture and Natural Resources issued Proclamation No. 476 granting CMU 3,401 hectares of land. On June 19, 1965, MAC became Central Mindanao University by virtue of Republic Act 4498. A total of 3,080 hectares was granted and titled in the name of CMU. Its charter mandates that the university shall provide programs of instruction at all levels in the arts, sciences, technical, professional, educational, and philosophical fields, and shall concern itself with pure and applied research in all branches of knowledge for the intellectual and professional growth of faculty members, for the advance instruction of students, and for increasing knowledge and understanding. Its long journey as a university leading to what it is today is attributable to the dedicated leaders, personnel and students who made their marks in the development of Central Mindanao University. At present, the University is under the leadership of Dr. Maria Luisa R. Soliven, who assumed the presidency on January 1, 2011 as the first woman president.
