Emerging countries are developing rapidly with a high demand for talent. In today’s global economy, working across borders is an inevitable trend. Therefore, how to develop digital, critical thinking, communication, global management skills and build personal brand has become an important part of career planning for young people. ■ Sharing: based on what you have observed, share with your group the resources, policies and practices of your country.
