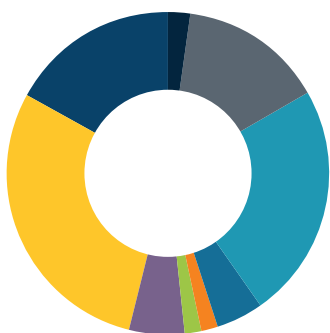

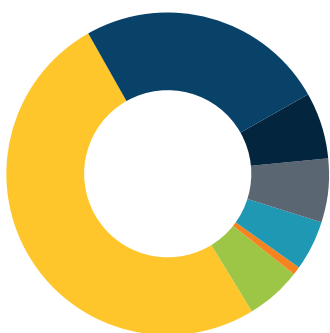

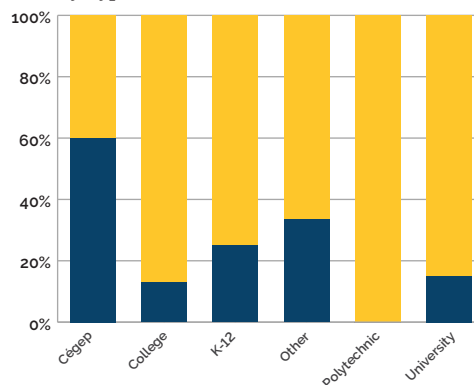

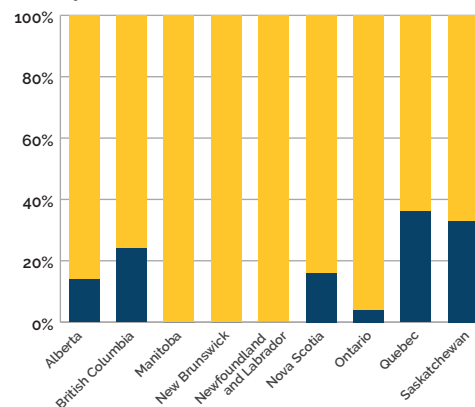
Does your institution have a pandemic plan or other similar emergency preparedness plans in place?

By Type of Institution

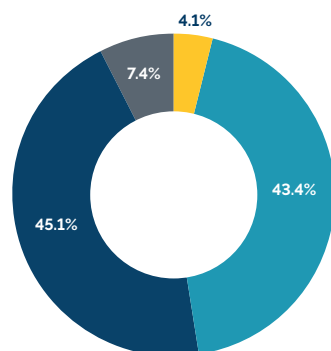

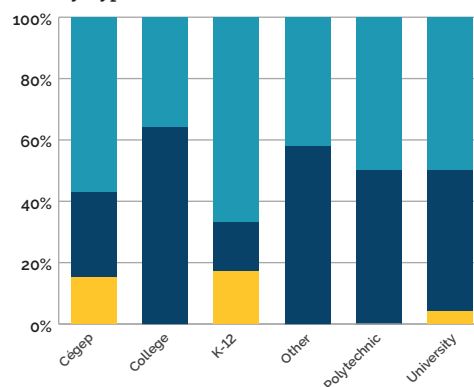
How has your institution responded to the current outbreak?



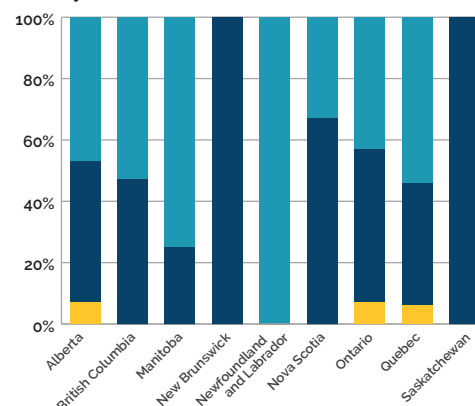
Almost 90% of institutions who responded are either developing a plan or implementing one.

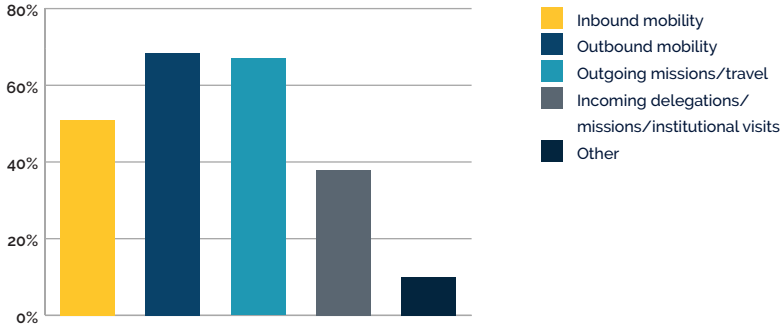
By Type of Institution



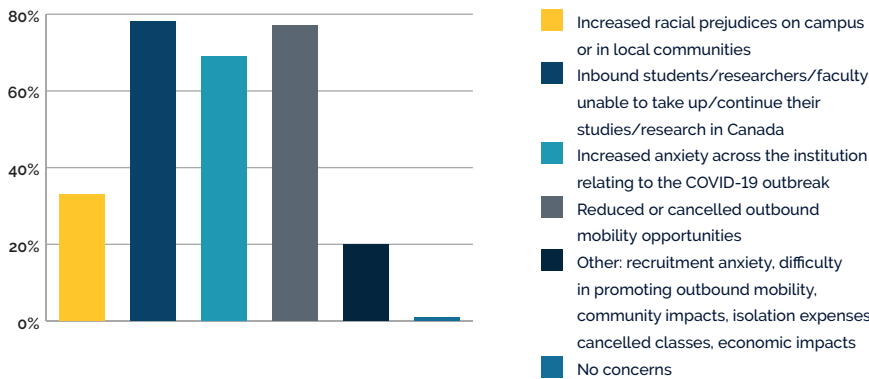

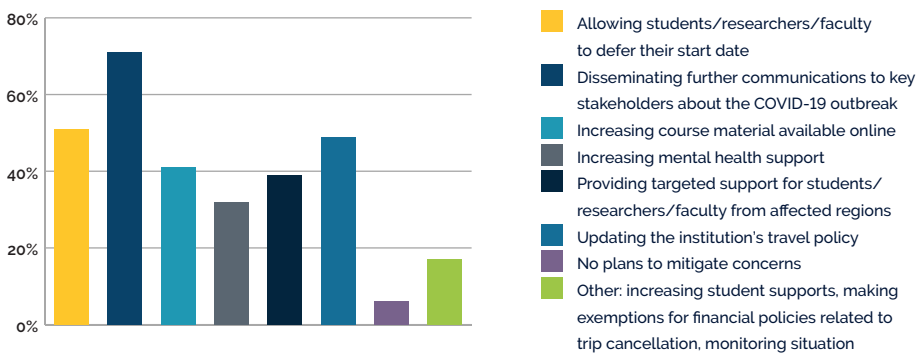
What is/are the area(s) of international education most significantly affected at your institution?
