

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CROSSROADS III

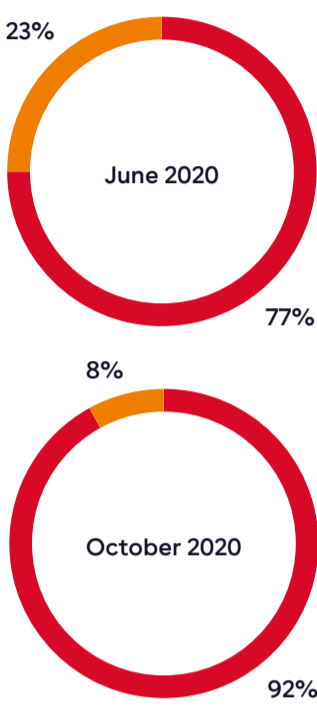
International student choices and motivations increasingly driven by the availability of on-campus, face-to-face teaching.

The third round of IDP Connect's study of international students shows increasingly positive perceptions of countries that have remained open during the pandemic, however many students are willing to change destination to achieve their ambitions for face-to-face learning. A growing number of students are more certain than at any point during the pandemic that they can reach their study ambitions as expected. They have a growing acceptance of the need to quarantine on arrival and to commence studies online as part of a blended delivery model.

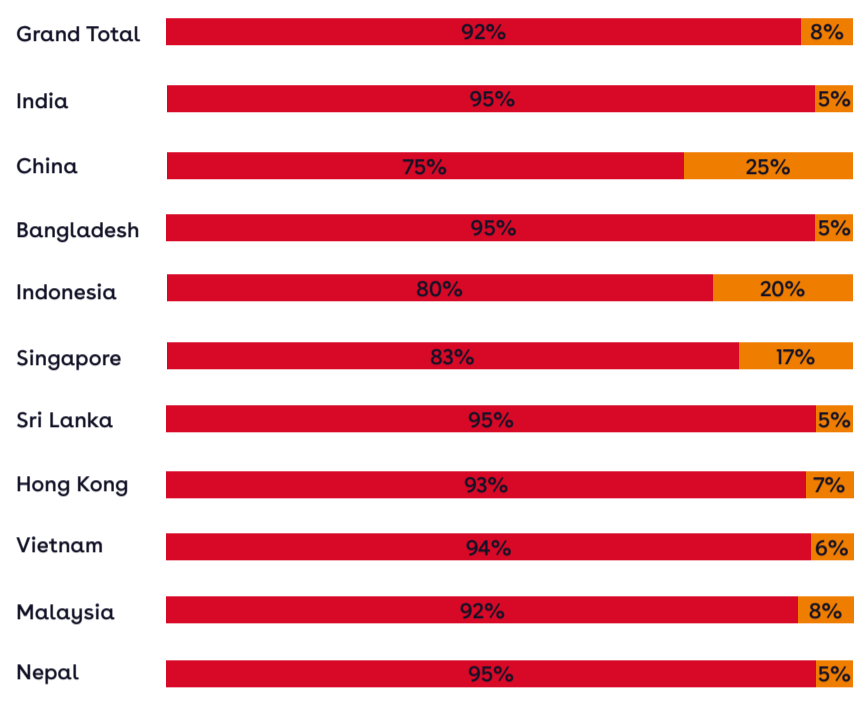
Expecting to commence studies as planned



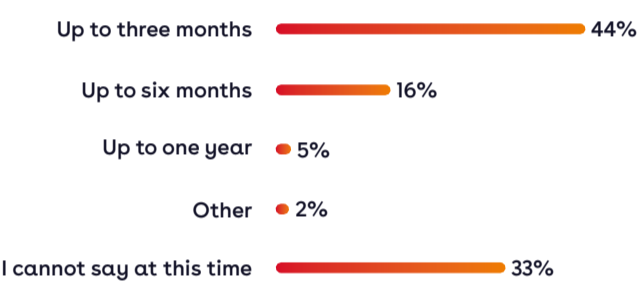
Willing to quarantine or rather defer?



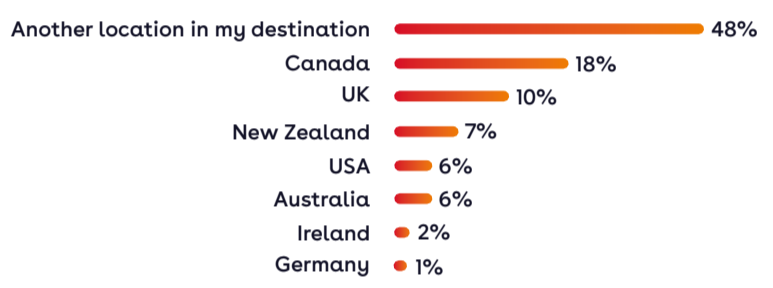
By place of origin



Length of time students are willing to study online before transferring to face-to-face

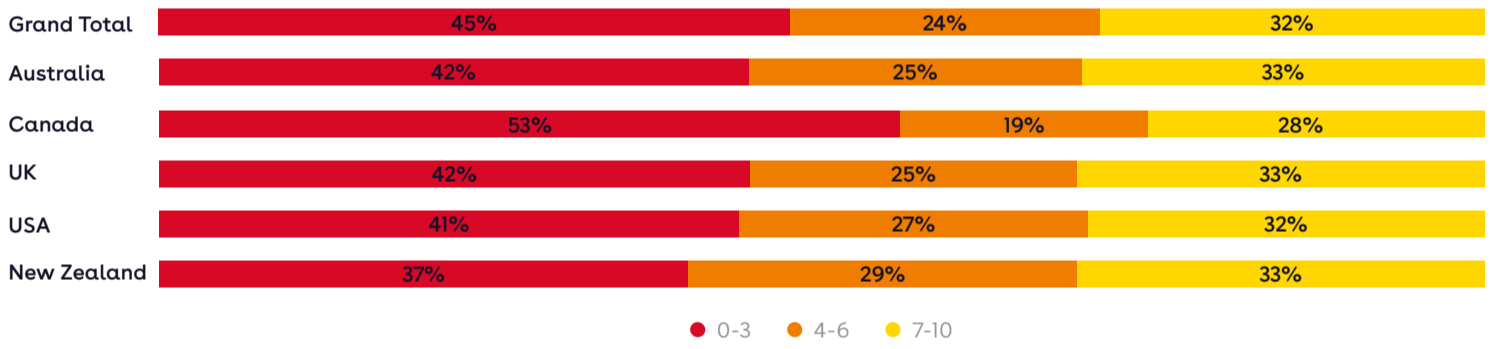


If considering switching where are you considering switching to?



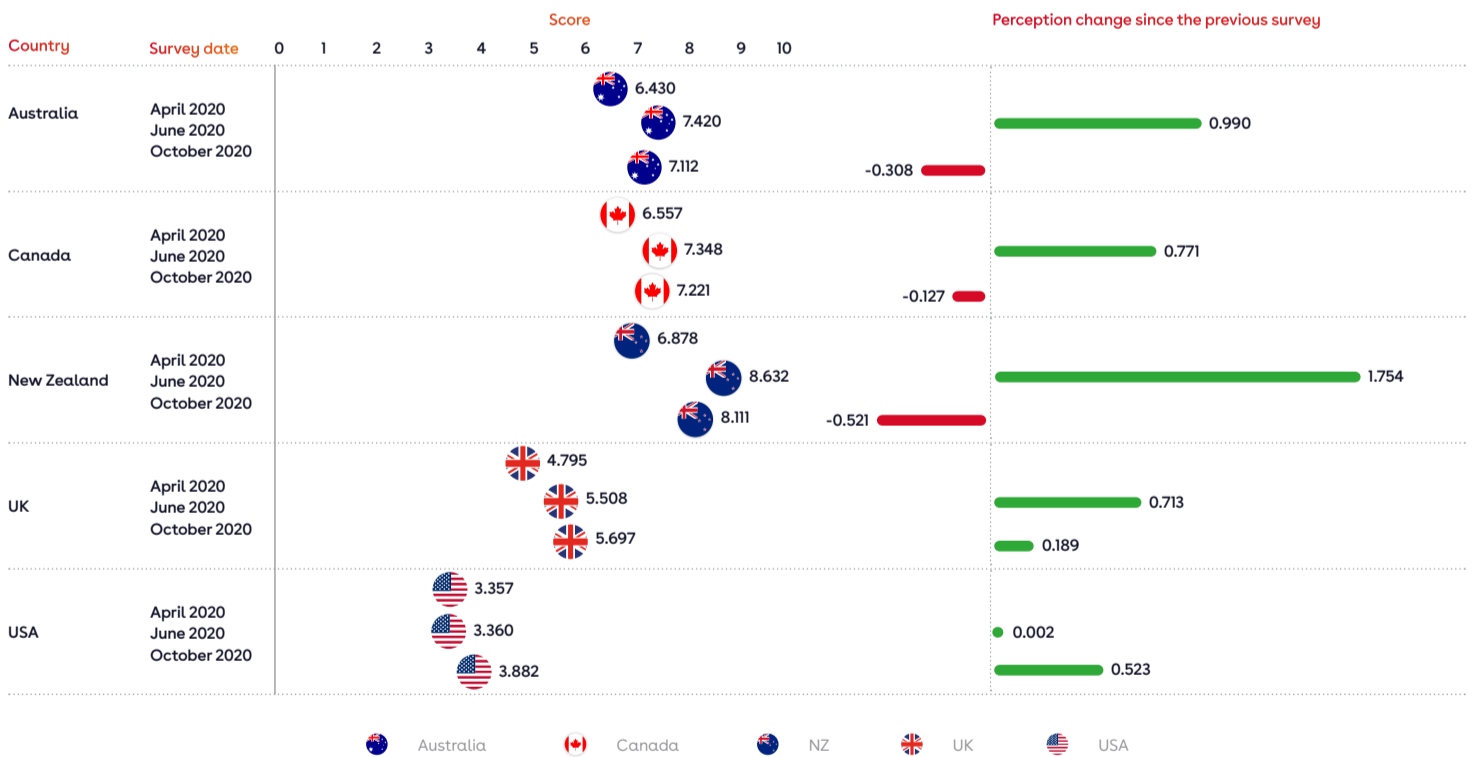
Likelihood of changing destination if able to start via face-to-face learning

Current destinations of choice

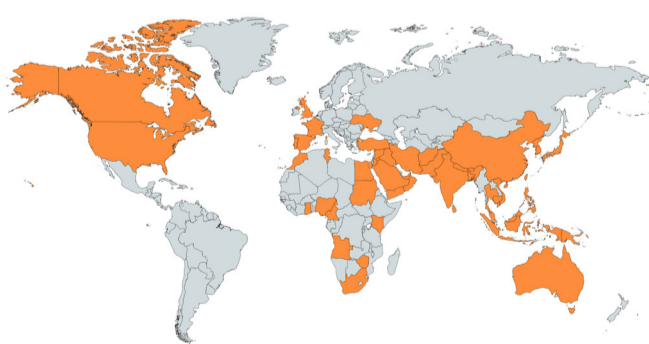


Perceived response to the Coronavirus

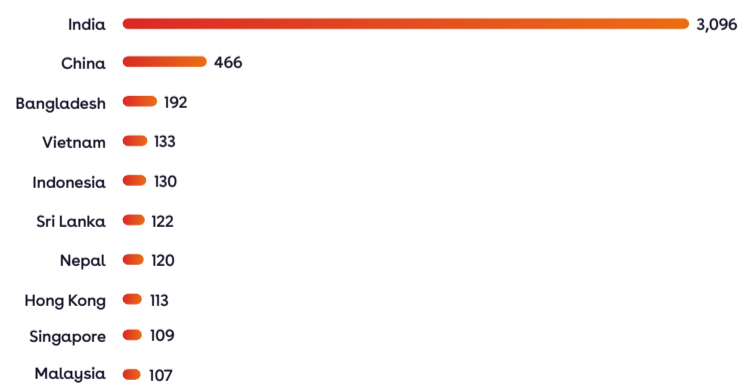
0 = Poor response, 10 = Excellent response



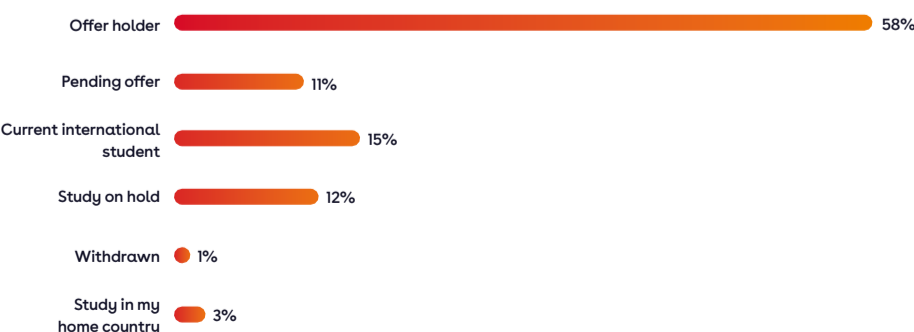
Global Coverage



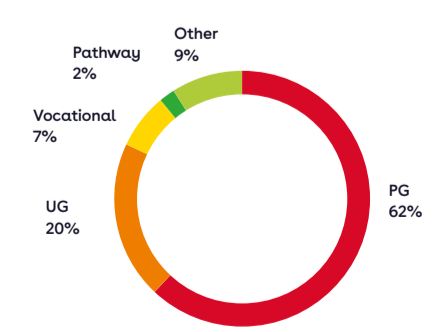
Origin of respondents - top 10
