Overview

This survey will gather data to help institutions, government, and other stakeholders gain insight into the motivations, values, and outcomes of physical and virtual learning abroad activities. The aim is to identify the impacts of learning abroad activities and inform efforts to develop more opportunities for students in Canada.
