

## Case Study: UCC and Canada, 2021-

- Co-authorship: 860 publications with University of Ottawa, University of Toronto, McGill University, University of Alberta, University of Montreal, University of Calgary and University of British Columbia
- Six Horizon Europe grants with Canadian industry and academic partners, €49M (Health, Food, Photonics)
- Canadian collaboration in European Research Council grant activity (eg Law)
- Canadian students Medicine, Dentistry and Masters and PhDs (1,763 since 2021)
- Food, Microbiome and Health significant opportunity



## Collaboration on Global Challenges



- Incentivize research collaborations and partnerships including co-authorship, joint research matching institutional strengths (Food, Sustainability, Health)
- Joint PhD programmes and doctoral mobility, supporting next generation global researchers
- Map relationships, activity and focus on key strengths/global challenges
- Multilateral focus Europe
   Strategic prioritization of Canadian universities as partners in Horizon Europe
  - European University Alliances explore extension of European multilateral partnerships to Canada –research, innovation, business and city engagement and joint programmes/mobility
