About Mexico

Mexico has an **extension of 1 964 375 km²** (758446 miles). It is a Federal Republic divided into 32 states, with Mexico City as its capital.

There are approximately 129 millions of inhabitants, being the biggest Spanish-speaker country in the world and home of 66 native languages.

Over **35 places declared as UNESCO World Heritage Site**. The 5th out of 12 megadiverse countries in the world. And one of the mostawarded cuisines on Earth.







Mexico's Higher Education

- 5,350,057 students enrolled in HEIs during the 2023 2024 school year.
- 4.89 million are enrolled at the undergraduate and graduate levels and 459 thousand students are enrolled in Postgraduate studies.
- The majority of higher education students are concentrated in the 18-22 age range.

Professional English for Talent Development in Strategic Industries in Jalisco State:


